## **LODGEMENT RULES**

Every participant is a welcomed guest.

All participants must always respect the following rules in order to spend a nice and peaceful period with their host.

- Your room and common areas of the flat (kitchen, bathroom, etc.) must be <u>kept tidy and clean</u> at all time. Arrange with roommates to do general cleaning at least <u>once a week</u> (including the floor).
- > Smoking is strictly forbidden in the flat.
- You are not allowed to invite people to the flat without the authorization of your host. You are responsible for your guests and their behavior (for damages too).
- > <u>It is forbidden to open to strangers!</u> Each participant is responsible for those who enter (except for EC staff, owner and eventual maintenance personnel) and their behaviour.
- Air the house every day and before leaving the flat make sure all windows and doors are safely closed. When the season starts to get warmer, open the windows only early in the morning and in the evening; keep them closed during the hottest hours to keep the house naturally cool.
- According to the current regulation of the city of Vicenza, it is allowed to turn on the <a href="heating">heating</a> from 15 October to 15 April for max. 14 hours a day (not at night) at a <a href="temperature of 19°C">temperature of 19°C</a> (± 2°C). - In Italy, as in most part of European countries, waste separation is in force. <u>Always remember to use distinct garbage bins</u> for different kind of rubbish: <u>organic</u> (brown), <u>plastic and metal</u> (blue), <u>paper</u> (white or yellow), <u>glass</u> (green), <u>unsorted waste</u> (black/big metal containers).
- > Before departure leave the accommodation tidy and clean.
- You must <u>immediately report to your host and Eurocultura within 24 hours</u> any damage to the flat, to the furniture or to other domestic appliances you might cause, as well as any other relevant fact might occur. Costs arising from <u>damages you might cause in the flat will be at your charge</u>. Everything must be solved before you leave! Contact your sending organization and Eurocultura for your <u>liability insurance</u>. If no one takes responsibility for the damage, the costs will be <u>equally divided among all the guests</u>.
- **Eurocultura accepts no liability** for any damage caused to persons, animals or property as a result of use or misuse of bicycles, mopeds, motorcycles or cars.

If you are sharing the flat with another student it's advisable to buy together some things such as sugar, salt, oil, milk, detergent.

<u>ATTENTION!</u> The house manager and the EC staff can do random controls!

## **GOOD HABITS**

- ➤ Each household has its own rules and habits. Be <u>discreet and attentive to details</u>, do your best to get used to the new lifestyle. It will be appreciated and ... your adaptability will increase!
- > Agreeing on the **sharing of common spaces** can take some time. Talk about it with your roommates, agree on times: nobody wants to be intrusive or invaded.

- > Some families take their **shoes** off at the entrance, or at most in the living area. Adapt to the habits of the household: it will be appreciated.

- ➤ If you come back late at night, when your roommates are asleep, **be quiet** and move **silently**.
- > If you plan to spend **one or more nights out**, inform your roommates: it's an act of respect.
- **Eat in the kitchen**, not in the bedroom! **6**
- ➤ Whenever you wash **the dishes**, check that they are actually clean before storing them in the larders.
- > Clean the hob, the kitchen countertops, the table and the oven every time you cook. Don't forget to clean the sponge you used.
- > Don't touch the cabinets and the refrigerator with dirty hands: always use the **handles**.
- Respect your space in the <u>refrigerator</u> and don't forget to check <u>your food's date of expire</u>.
  Cover the food to avoid unpleasant smells.
- > Take care of your **clothes**, don't leave them around the house!
- > If you use a **broom**, don't forget to remove any hair or lint after every use.
- Leave the **bathroom** clean...and scented.
- > Do not throw away wipes, make-up remover pads, cotton swabs and tampons in the toilet: throw only **toilet paper**.
- Domestic appliances and equipment must <u>be used with care and moderation</u>, according to the rules of your host. Don't forget to <u>switch off lights and all household devices</u> after use.
